The Swedish Delegation for Circular Economy

In 2018 the Swedish government decided to form a Delegation for Circular Economy to support the national Swedish adaption to a Circular Economy, in all sectors of the society. Weine will present the Swedish National Strategy for Circular Economy that was released earlier this year and also give some examples on circular procurement as an important tool for municipalities.

Laura Vidje Sustainability Consultant

Laura has been involved in numerous projects and awarded with titles for her sustainability talents. She is conducting an external analysis which looks at the best practice examples around the Nordics and EU for circular economy actions in municipalities and regions. The report will reflect on: What do the municipalities need today in their development work? What tools and methods can be used in the future work with the circular economy? Which efforts have the best effect?





There are many unknown effects in the transition to circular economy, but with the use of models we can create insight into the space of opportunity. The Ministry of Climate and the Environment has co-financed a study initiated by Avfall Norge Virke, LO and SINTEF, which explains the potential value creation and employment effects of a Norwegian circular economy.
