


#### The Objectives of the Delegation

- Prepare a strategy for the Delegation's work towards a transition to a circular and bio-based economy. It should include how the transition can be stimulated at different levels in society.
- Be a point of contact between relevant stakeholders in order to facilitate the work and create synergies.
- Identify obstacles and countermeasures, the need for training, information and provide advice and propose cost-effective measures to the government.
- Constitute a knowledge center and be responsible for external monitoring by gathering good examples and information on ongoing significant initiatives and facilitating effective collaboration between them.
- Appoint a reference group


